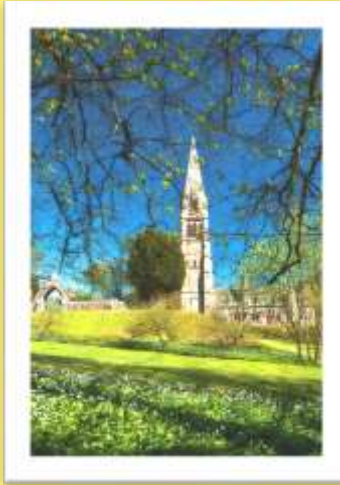


AIMS
